

Prayer in Jesus Christ's Name is Powerful

It takes faith to be saved and to accept our lovely Jesus Christ into our hearts. It takes faith to believe all things are possible in our God and His Son. To have a powerful prayer life it takes faith. Faith in Father God and Jesus Christ produces prayers of power.

Hebrews 11:6 states: But without faith it is impossible to please Him: for he that cometh to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him.

When we say a prayer of faith in Jesus Christ's Name and accept Him into our hearts it is a mighty powerful weapon that loosens the shackles of sin's bondage off of our lives.

We have been given a powerful weapon through prayer. Not only is it the way we communicate to our Father God in Heaven through Jesus Christ, it's also one of our weapons of our warfare. (Ephesians 6:18) Our weapons are not carnal or of this world but mighty through God to the pulling down of strongholds as 2 Corinthians 10:4 tells us.

What is a stronghold? It's a well-fortified place; fortress. A place that serves as the center of a group, as of militants or of persons holding a controversial viewpoint. In other words a bunch of loser demons, fallen ones, and nephilm are most likely camping at these locations. At least one or the other if not all three and they are usually being built around a person's life. A prayer of faith in Jesus Christ's Name can change this.

Prayer can be utilized in many powerful ways and is one such weapon we must learn and understand how to use correctly.

We have many examples of powerful prayers we can study, utilize and pray from the Holy Bible to aid us in our prayer life. One given is the powerful Lord's Prayer found in Matthew 6:9-13. Other examples are: David's prayer of repentance Psalms 51; Asaph's prayer of despair Psalms 77:1-2; Jesus Christ's prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane John 17; Solomon's prayer of dedication 2 Chronicles 6:14-42; Jabez's prayer 1 Chronicles 4:10; David's prayer for safety Psalms 57; Asa's battle prayer 2 Chronicle 14:11-15 and so many more.

We read in Mark 11 an example of a mountain moving prayer of faith. It is Jesus Christ speaking and reads as follows:

Mark 11:22-24

22 And Jesus answering saith unto them, Have faith in God.

23 For verily I say unto you, That whosoever shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he saith.

24 Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them.

The Word of God says we shall have them....our prayers answered. This is because of our faith is in Jesus Christ and His Name. He cannot lie. (Titus 1:2; Numbers 23:19; Hebrews 6:18) But

we must believe He's all that the Word of God tells us He is...and Father God too, but also so much more.

John 14: 14. "If ye shall ask anything in my name, I will do it.

Again, I say we must believe. (Mark 5:36; 11:24; Hebrews 11:6)

We must never forget that Jesus Christ has been given that Name above all names. It's highly exalted above all others. (Philippians 2:9-11) It's all powerful! (Mark 16:17-18) Why? Because the power of the godhead resides in Him. (Colossians 1:19; 2:11; 1 John 5:7-8) Meaning God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit's power resides inside of Him. His Name is part of Him too..

It is through Jesus Christ's Name, our faith, and the anointing of his Holy Spirit (1 John 1:27) that our prayers can become more powerful and we begin to heal the sick, raise the dead, cast out demons, and do all we're called to do. Demons are afraid of Father God and Jesus Christ and the power of His Name. We know this because James 2:19 says, "Thou believest there is one God; thou doest well; the devils also believe and tremble. Also, John 10:30 identifies Father God and Jesus Christ as One.

Powers and principalities are subject to Jesus Christ through the power of Father God that he has bestowed upon Him in love. (Colossians 1:16; 2:9-10; Ephesians 1:19-23) And to His believers He has extended His great power and Name. Luke 10:19 Behold, I give unto you power to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy: and nothing shall by any means hurt you.

We as believers must take hold of the fact that Jesus Christ, Yeshua Ha Mashiach the all-powerful Son of the living God Jehovah lives inside of us. But not only Him alone but also Father God and the sweet Holy Spirit. We must fully realize to whom we belong. We are God's children and in Him in faith our prayers are heard and will be answered. When we recognize and learn the true power of His Name it will increase our holy faith (Jude 20) to where we can believe all things are possible through Jesus Christ God's Son. (Matthew 16:20) Then our prayers will become mighty and powerful in Him. It takes faith in Him. Only believe.

We have been taught to pray and believe our prayers are heard and this is good. However, are we praying effectively and fervently (James 5:16) so our prayers have the full power of Father God and Jesus Christ behind them? We must believe and have faith that our God is all He says He is because He is. The prayer of faith is a powerful weapon when prayed in Jesus Christ's Name.

In addition, Father God shows no partiality when someone prays in faith. In his Holy Word in Romans 2:11, Paul says, "For there is no respect of persons with God." Therefore, if He moves through my prayers of faith, He will move through yours.

All it takes is faith. Faith means to believe. Only believe (Mark 11:24)..... Only believe every word in the Holy Bible is true. Only believe and you will be saved. (Acts 16:31; Romans 10:9-10) Only believe that Jesus Christ and His name are all powerful.

Have faith in your God and He will move when you pray in Jesus Christ's Name. (John 14:14; 1 John 5:14) James 5:16 affirms this:The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much.

To pray effectively and powerfully you can ask the sweet Holy Spirit to lead you and teach you how to pray in every situation. He will because He is our teacher. (John 14:26.)

Pray about everything (Colossians 4:2; Romans 12:12) believing in faith and knowing He hears you. (Philippians 4:6-7; Jeremiah 29:12; 33:3)

Never forget His Word is true. (Psalms 119:160; John 17:17; Proverbs 30:5)

Learn and stand upon His Word and in Him in faith. (1 Corinthians 16:13; Galatians 5:1;

Philippians 4:1; Joshua 1:8-9)

Jesus Christ cannot fail and neither can His Word. (Isaiah 40:8; 1 Chronicles 28:20; Numbers 23:19)

If you've been given the gift of speaking in holy tongues you can also ask Holy Spirit, our Friend and teacher to pray through you. How do we know to do this? Because Romans 8:26 declares: Likewise, the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered.

Our prayers are powerful because we pray them in faith in Jesus Christ's mighty Name. It's all Him and what He has done for us to ensure our victory through Him. (Romans 8:37; Revelation 12:11; 1 Corinthians 15:57) A powerful prayer must have faith prayed in Jesus Christ's Name. It does not have to be a long prayer. It needs only to be earnestly prayed in faith, believing He hears us and will answer.

It comes down to this:

Believe and have faith that every word of God is true. Believe that you can and will become an unstoppable force for the Kingdom of God through Jesus Christ. And when you pray, live your life, and do all according to His will in Jesus Christ's Name, you will do more than just survive. You will conquer and overcome through your Savior Jesus Christ.

Romans 8: 37 Nay, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him that loved us.

Luke 1:37 For with God nothing shall be impossible.

Philippians 4:13 I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me.

Psalms 108:13 Through God we shall do valiantly: for he it is that shall tread down our enemies.

1 John 5: 4-5

4 For whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world: and this is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith.

5 Who is he that overcometh the world, but he that believeth that Jesus is the Son of God?
